Student Successes

All of our students completed a reading age test in September, and were re-tested at the start of this term. A whopping 62.5% have improved their reading age on this test (60 students). Of these, 32% have improved by up to 1 year, 33% by 1-2 years and 17% by 2-3 years. 4 students saw an improvement of 3-4 years, 2 of whom improved by 4 years 4 months and 4 years 6 months respectively. In addition, 5 students who were previously unable to access the test in September now have a reading age.

Thank you for your continued support with your child's reading, particularly in the way you encourage students to read at home using our Sora app.

Key Stage 4 English Presentations

Since the start of this term, students in Mrs Jones' Key Stage 4 English class have been preparing presentations on a topic of their choice for their spoken language component of GCSE English Language. Rosewood and Birch Humanities lessons

On Tuesday in Humanities students in Rosewood and Birch experienced the story of Exodus and Passover. 
Breakthrou'dance: JUNIORS (7-12yrs), YOUTH (13-18yrs) ADULT (18yrs+)
