Students in Spruce had a chat about the wildlife they watch through the classroom window and then the judges joined a Key Stage 3 class in the Forest School area with Miss Russell.

We were delighted to get an invite to the Awards Ceremony at the New Vic Theatre last weekend and even more delighted to get our Bronze award in the schools category. The judges said our Forest School area showed that we are encouraging wildlife and giving students the opportunity to learn outdoors. Next year- we are going for gold!
